Though, "Indian Classical Music" represents an exemplary standard and long established principle based on methods developed over a long period of time. Therefore, this course tends to teach the students discipline of classical music, more importantly the importance of discipline in India Classical Music.

Indian Music is a very vast subject. It includes many Ragas, Taals, Alankars, Gharanas, Khyal, drupad,-dhamar and much more. Thus, through this course students will learn different Ragas, taal, basic concepts of Indian Music, and the notation system. History of Indian music, origin and development of Gharana Tradition. Students will also gain knowledge about the Ravindra Sangeet and Carnatic sangeet along with the biographies of some distinguished artists and scholars of Indian Music. They will also be introduced to the musical stage performance. So that they can be familiar with the stage and will be prepared to enter the world of performing arts.

Through the course curriculum, students are able to acquire a critical understanding about musicology, historical aspects pertaining to Indian Music. It will develop an analytical approach towards both music theory and practical. The curriculum also aims to initiate the process of research on the relevant topic after review of literature and discussion with the supervisors. Through this syllabus students would be able to achieve an overall understanding of performing research ability which will enhance their musical intelligence. Hence, they will be equipped for a wide variety of careers and build a strong foundation for the nation.

Program Outcomes-Sitar/Guitar

This program will introduce the student with the playing techniques of sitar on different Ragas & taals. It will make the learner aware about the historical development of sitar as an instrument. Students will also know about the basic terminologies of Music & Sitar with theoretical detail of Ragas. They will learn about the different concepts of laya, taal& alap. They will develop different techniques of playing the sitar along with ornamentation and learning masitkhani and Razakhani gats along with the development of stage performances and complete theoretical, practical and analytical knowledge of Raga & Taal.



The students will develop the ability to read and write the notation of competition according to well defined notation system i.e. Bhatkhande swarlipi Padhati, which will help them in understanding new compositions by various composers of Hindustani Music.

Through this program, students will know about the different gharanas of the instrument and their distinguished playing techniques. They will be enhanced with the knowledge of renewed musical personalities. They will be articulate about the musical aspects with respect to classical music.

Program Outcomes-(Tabla)

The objective of this course is to provide the students with the introduction to Tabla, the Indian classical key percussion instrument. It will give students an overall idea of solo and accompaniment ability. They will learn different compositions in different Taals. They will also gain knowledge of advanced Taals, light Taals, which will make them confident in accompaniment with both classical and light or folic music.

This course will give ideas to the students about some inevitable items such as the development of the instrument, notation system, laya-layakari method. Students will know the usefulness of their instrument, they will familiarize with Indian tradition music by importing knowledge of Indian tradition music by importing knowledge of Indian musical heritage. Since Tabla is a practical subject the more focus will be on the practical side, and make the student Tabla player. They will also get to know about various Tabla Gharanas and their playing style.

The program will aim to prepare students for the stage performance and accompanying classical semi-classical music. Light music, folk music etc.
